


Pennsylvania Access Strategy PDF Map Usage

The maps exported to Adobe PDF format from Pennsylvania's Fishing and Boating Access Strategy include the ability to toggle the GIS layers that make up the map, as well as the ability to access key attributes of the GIS layers critical to each map. Statewide Maps include attributes for the particular criteria layer(s) being illustrated, whereas the Watershed Maps include attributes for all mapped criteria for the particular watershed. Following are instructions to access the layers and attributes.


Layers

1. Upon opening a map, click on the "Layers" tab (or button depending on Adobe version) to the left side of the map.
2. There will be multiple layer entries with the primary one being a folder called "Map Layers"
3. Click the plus (+) next to the Map Layers folder
4. Use the eye  icon to toggle the display of any layer you wish
5. Layers indicated as "Other" are usually items outside the map (i.e. titles, north arrow, etc)
6. Layers with the word "Anno" are map labels

Attributes

1. Upon opening a map, choose *Tools-Analysis-Object Data Tool* (In Versions prior to Adobe 9, this may be *Tools-Object Data-Object Data Tool*)
2. Move your cursor over the map and when you get to a feature with attributes, the cursor will change to a plus (+)
3. Click the feature and all available features with attributes will highlight
4. Click a feature of interest that is highlighted and just the features from that layer highlight
5. Click the feature of interest again and the attributes are displayed in the bottom left corner of the window
 - a. The layer name the feature came from is shown in the "Model Tree" (top left of window)
6. *Optional* – change the highlight color by clicking the Color square above the list of layers and choosing your desired color
 - a. *Optional* – you can click on the any of the other features listed for the layer in the "Model Tree" and the feature is highlighted on the map
7. *Optional* – right-click the feature name in the "Model Tree" for other options

Other

1. If using Adobe version 9 or higher, Latitude/Longitude coordinates are available by going to *Tools-Analysis-Geospatial Location Tool*. The coordinates displayed are the position of your cursor.
 - a. If you right-click on the map, you can choose *Find a Location* to type in a Latitude/Longitude and find/zoom to it on the map. Push Enter or use the  icon to go to the entered location.
2. You can place the aforementioned Analysis Tools in a Toolbar by going to *Tools-Analysis-Show Analysis Toolbar*
