## Stevens Lake

## 2018 Largemouth Bass Survey

<u>Stevens Lake</u> is a 62-acre Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission impoundment located 3.5 miles north of Tunkhannock. Largemouth Bass harvest is managed with <u>Big Bass Regulations</u>. Harvest of all other species is managed by <u>Commonwealth Inland Waters Regulations</u>.




Figure 1. Length-frequency distribution of Largemouth Bass captured at Stevens Lake on May 24, 2018.

Area 4 biologists used night electrofishing to assess the Largemouth Bass population at Stevens Lake on May 24, 2018. The work was part of an established monitoring strategy. During six ten-minute long electrofishing runs we captured 82 Largemouth Bass ranging from 5.0 to 18.9 inches (Figure 1). The heaviest weighed 3.1 pounds. Mean catch per unit effort values were: 80.1/hour for total catch; 25.4/hour for bass  $\geq$  12 inches; and 5.9/hour for bass  $\geq$  15 inches. These values exceeded statewide guidelines for Big Bass waters (Table 1), demonstrating that Stevens Lake supported a very good bass population.

Fishing for bass at Stevens Lake is usually best from fall through early spring. The lake gets very weedy during the summer.
