## Glendale Lake Cambria County

### April and May 2018 Survey

Glendale Lake is a 1,601-acre impoundment located in Cambria County approximately three miles south of Coalport and 15 miles north of Altoona. The Department of Conservation and Natural Resources owns the dam and lake as part of <u>Prince Gallitzin State Park</u>.

Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission (PFBC) Fisheries Management Area 3 with assistance from Fisheries Management Warmwater Unit, and Habitat Management Division staff sampled Glendale Lake during the week of April 16th, 2018 primarily to assess the Muskellunge and panfish populations. Staff fished Pennsylvania style trap-nets at 19 locations along the lakeshore. In addition, Area 3 staff conducted an Angler use and opinion survey on May 5, 2018. Results of the trap-net and angler survey are presented below.
