Foster Joseph Sayers Lake Centre County May 2018 Trap-net Survey


Foster Joseph Sayers Lake is a 1,730 acre flood control impoundment located at Bald Eagle State Park about 15 miles northeast of State College, Centre County. The primary function of the reservoir is to provide flood control; as such, the dam and lake levels are managed by the US Army Corp of Engineer. The lake is substantially drawn down during the fall and winter months. Locally called "Sayers Lake", "Howard Dam", or "the Dam", this reservoir is popular with anglers and boaters

During the week of May 29, 2018, Fisheries Management Area 3 staff conducted a trap-net survey at the reservoir at 15 different sites. Results of the survey are below.
