2021 Black Bass Survey



Hammond Lake Largemouth Bass caught June 2021.

<u>Hammond Lake</u> is a 640-acre US Army Corps of Engineers impoundment in Tioga County. The Corps provide many amenities at the lake including boat launches, a swimming area with bathhouse, picnic areas and <u>Ives Run Campground</u>. The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission in cooperation with local groups and the US Army Corps of Engineers have placed numerous <u>habitat structures</u> in Hammond Lake.

Fisheries Management Area 4 biologists conducted a night boat electrofishing survey of Hammond Lake on June 9, 2021 to capture Largemouth Bass and Smallmouth Bass. Total night electrofishing catch rate for both black bass species was 106/hour. Largemouth Bass comprised 69% and Smallmouth Bass comprised 31% of the total bass catch. The bass ranged from 4 to 19 inches in total length (Figure 2.) The catch rate for all bass \geq 12 inches was 33.3/hour, and the catch rate for all bass \geq 15 inches was 17.7/hour. By contrast, these values during the previous surveys (2013, 2008 and 1999) serve to illustrate an increasing population of black bass in Hammond Lake (Table 1).




Figure 1. Length frequency distribution of Largemouth and Smallmouth Bass caught on June 9, 2021 from Hammond Lake.
