

White Crappies 	Habitat Large ponds, lakes and reservoirs under sub-merged trees, logs and stumps. Smallmouth Bass 	Habitat Warm streams and rivers with gravel bottoms; Rocky areas along weed beds; A few clear lakes, ponds and reservoirs	Bait Crayfish, minnows, hellgrammite fished on a jig-head or a light wire hook drifted on the bottom or under a bobber	Type Lures Color Line Hook Size Lure Size	Bucktail jigs, crankbaits, spinners, twisters, top-water poppers & stickbaits Brown, black, motor-oil green, shad colored 4-10 lb. <p>Walleye</p> 	<p>Habitat Deep, clear lakes and large rivers with a rocky or gravel bottom</p>	<p>Bait Minnows, leeches, night crawlers fished on a gig head or a slip ring on or near the bottom</p>	<p>Type Lures Color Line Hook Size Lure Size</p>	<p>Jigs, crankbaits, twisters, and spinners Bright green, yellow, gold, silver, black and purple 6-12 lb. <p>Channel Catfish Bullheads</p> 	<p>Habitat Variety of places including clear deep rivers to muddy ponds and lakes</p>	<p>Bait Chicken or beef livers, cut bait, minnows or prepared stink-bait fished on the bottom with a single or treble hook slip rig</p>	<p>Type Lures Color Line Hook Size Lure Size</p>	<p>Spinners and jigs tipped with a minnow or nightcrawler 10 lb. Test 4</p>	<p>Summer Early to Mid June</p>	<p>Nighttime</p>
<p>Carp</p> 	<p>Habitat Slow brackish rivers, ponds and lakes with lots of weeds</p>	<p>Bait Corn, night crawlers or prepared dough-balls fished on a single or treble hook on the bottom</p>	<p>Line Hook Size</p>	<p>6 lb. Test 6 and up</p>	<p>ALL Seasons</p>	<p>Daytime</p>
<p>Suckers</p> 	<p>Habitat Streams and rivers with a rocky, gravel bottom, mouths of feeder streams, especially in the Spring</p>	<p>Bait Corn, nightcrawler fished on the bottom</p>	<p>Line Hook Size</p>	<p>2-4 lb. Test 4-12</p>	<p>Early Spring</p>	<p>Daytime</p>
<p>Trout: Brown, Rainbow, Brook</p> 	<p>Habitat Cold clear lakes and streams, and some rivers</p>	<p>Bait Minnows, worms, salmon eggs, corn, cheese, prepared baits fished on light wire hook drifted on the bottom</p>	<p>Type Lures Line Hook Size Lure Size</p>	<p>Spinners and small crankbaits 2-8 lb. Test 6-14 1/32 to 1/8 oz.</p>	<p>Spring Summer</p>	<p>Mid-day Early morning Early evening</p>
