



BROWN TROUT

Salmo trutta



Brown Trout are not native to Pennsylvania, although they are now naturalized and widespread here in the wild.

Brown Trout were originally found in Eurasia (Scotland & Germany) and were stocked in the late 1800s in the United States. In 1886 they arrived in PA.

Brown Trout are brownish in color. The back and upper sides are dark-brown to gray-brown. The sides can be yellow-brown to silvery with dark spots outlined with pale halos. Spots are also found on the dorsal fin (top fin) and the tail. Some Brown Trout will get a reddish/orange color on their tail fin and other fins too. The belly is white-yellow.
