

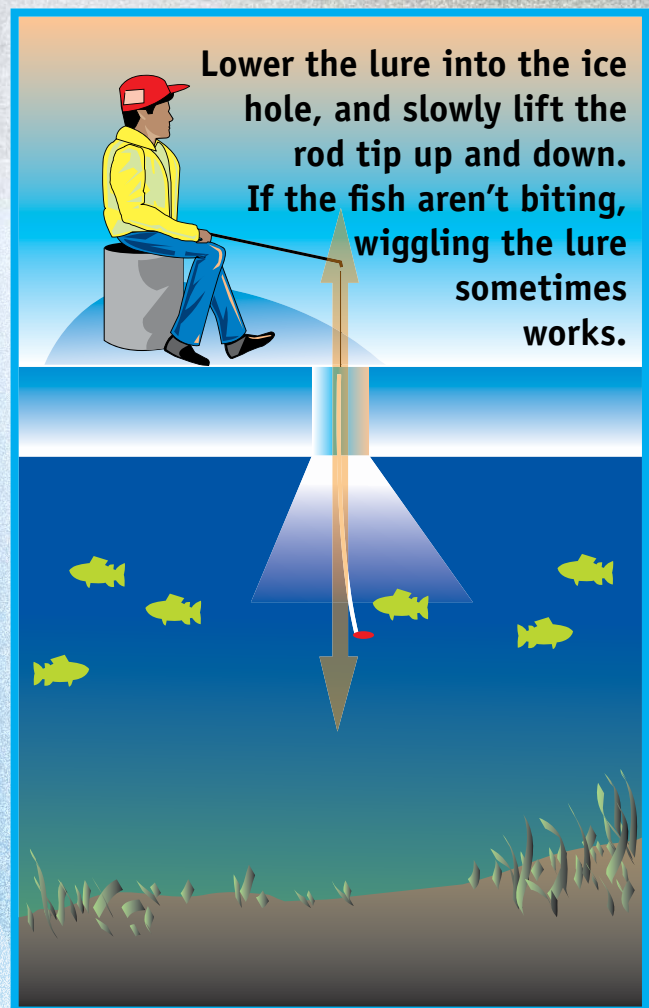
Dance a Little Jig!

When tip-up action is slow, jigging is a good technique. Jigging combos look like miniature spinning rod outfits. The tackle works the same way, but the technique and lures are different.

There are several types of ice fishing lures. Jigs are hooks with molded lead weights. They are brightly colored and sometimes have feathers or yarn. Flash baits are similar to spoons. They flutter and flash. Swimming lures swim or spin in circles as they are jigged.



Try adding live bait on the hook to entice fish. Minnows, maggots, and waxworms work well.
