

Float Plan

A float plan is an important piece of safety information. Float plans are used to let others know where you will be, when you will be there and when you plan on ending your day on the water. Float plans include:

1. Location
2. Date and time of departure
3. Date and time of return
4. Time and location of stops
5. Names of people onboard

6. Emergency contact information
7. Description of boats, including size and color

Leave a copy of the float plan with a responsible adult, and enjoy fishing from your human-powered boat.
