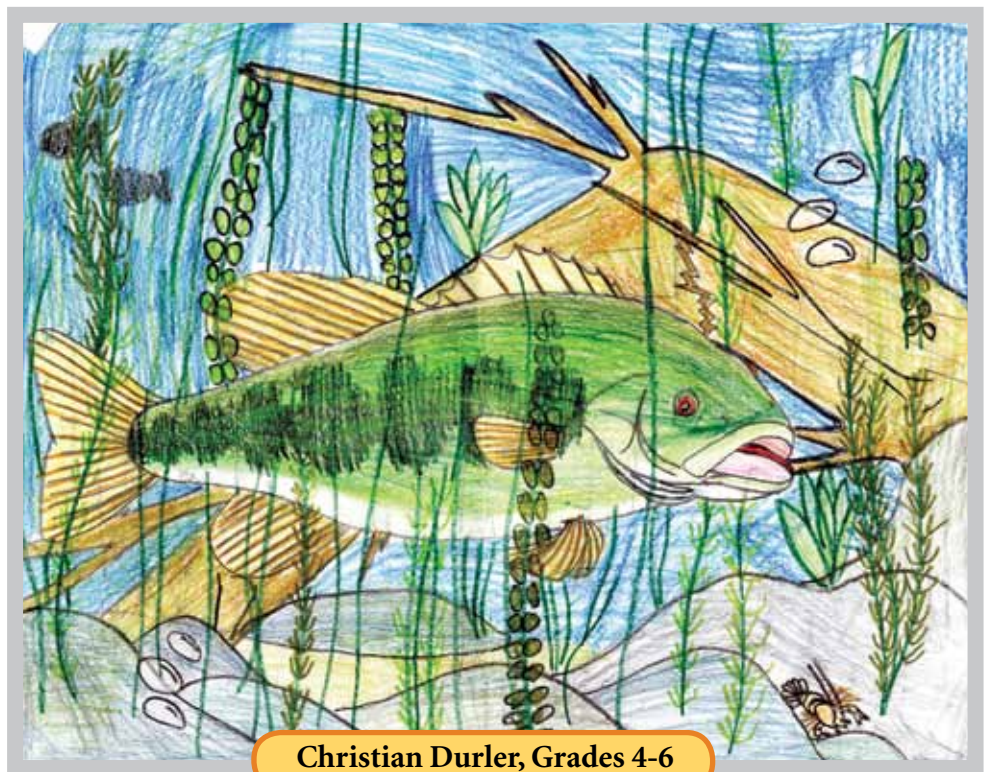

The State-Fish Art Contest requires students in grades 4 through 12 to depict any official state fish and provide an essay on that fish's characteristics,

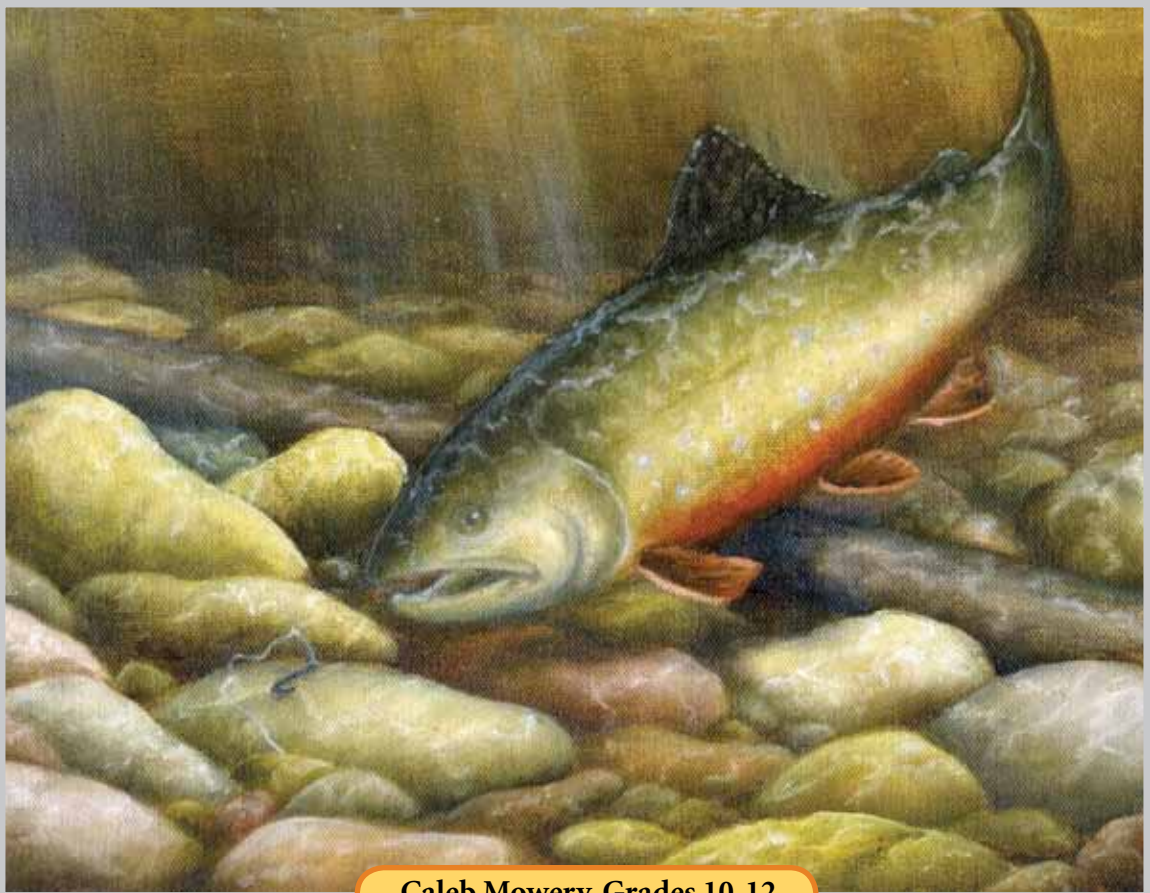
behavior, habitat or efforts to conserve it. Pennsylvania's official state fish is the brook trout.
