Feature Fish

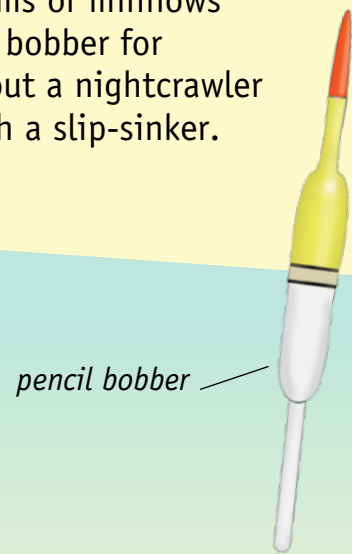
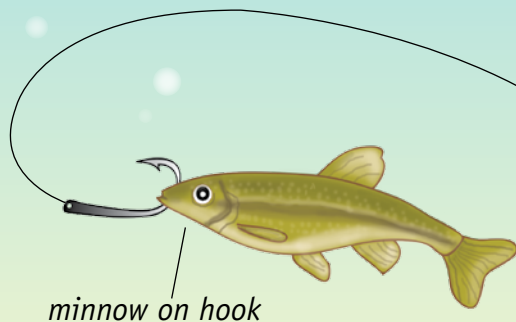
Sauger, Walleye, catfish and panfish are found in these rivers.

Techniques

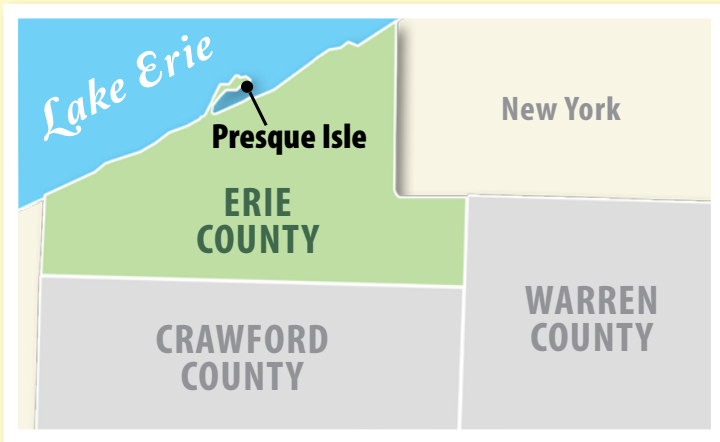
Try red worms or minnows under a pencil bobber for panfish. Cast out a nightcrawler on a jig or with a slip-sinker.



Erie

Erie is the city on the Great Lake that shares its name. The main lake is popular for boaters who enjoy fishing for Lake Trout and Walleyes, but there are also shoreline fishing

opportunities at Presque Isle State Park, Erie County. Presque Isle State Park is a 3,200-acre sandy peninsula that arches into Lake Erie forming Presque Isle Bay.



Fishing Spot

Popular shore fishing locations along Presque Isle Bay are Waterworks, Ferry Dock, East Pier, West Pier, Perry Monument and North Pier. There are ADA accessible fishing piers at the East Pier and West Pier. For a detailed map of Presque Isle State Park, visit www.dcnr.state.pa.us.

Techniques

Crankbaits and spinnerbaits will draw the attention of bass or a bite from a Muskellunge or Northern Pike. Toss minnows or worms under a bobber or on the bottom as a live bait option for bass and panfish.
