

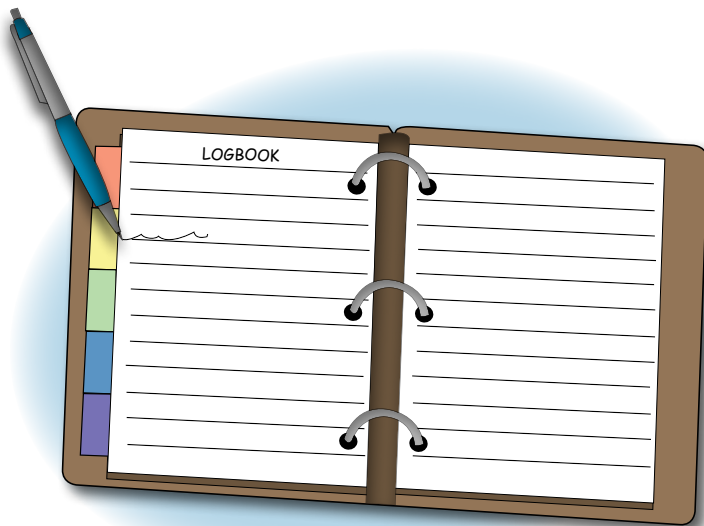
# “Reel in the Memories”



Collecting information on each fishing trip can make you a better angler and saves your memories for the future.

Some information to record in a logbook includes:

- weather conditions such as if it's sunny or cloudy outside
- water temperature
- water clarity
- air temperature
- moon phase
- number, size and species of fish caught
- baits, flies or lures used



When this information is collected, enter it into a logbook or computer. This is a great way at the end of the year to look back and see how many fish you caught. Also, it's a way to learn from past experience

on the water. If a Smallmouth Bass hit a red crayfish lure during low and clear conditions this year, it's a good possibility that under those conditions one will hit again on a future fishing trip.
