



The Lures of Pennsylvania Waters

Lure fishing is full of action. Fish attack plastic, metal or wood objects as if they are live bait.



Surface:



Surface Lures

Treble hooks with bodies made of wood or plastic. These lures imitate mice, frogs or injured fish when reeled across the water.



Artificial Flies

Constructed of hooks, feathers and synthetic materials, flies imitate small, aquatic or terrestrial animals and insects.

Jigs

Jigs are a weighted lead head hook, covered with a minnow or plastic worm. Jigs are bobbed in a vertical motion to attract fish.



Plugs

Plugs also known as crankbaits are lures that dive or dart back and forth in the water. Crankbaits imitate minnows or deep-bodied prey and are fished on top of the water or deep down in the water.



Spinners

Named after metal blades that spin (when reeled in), spinners flash and vibrate to look like baitfish.
