Avoiding conflicts between floaters (boaters) and anglers

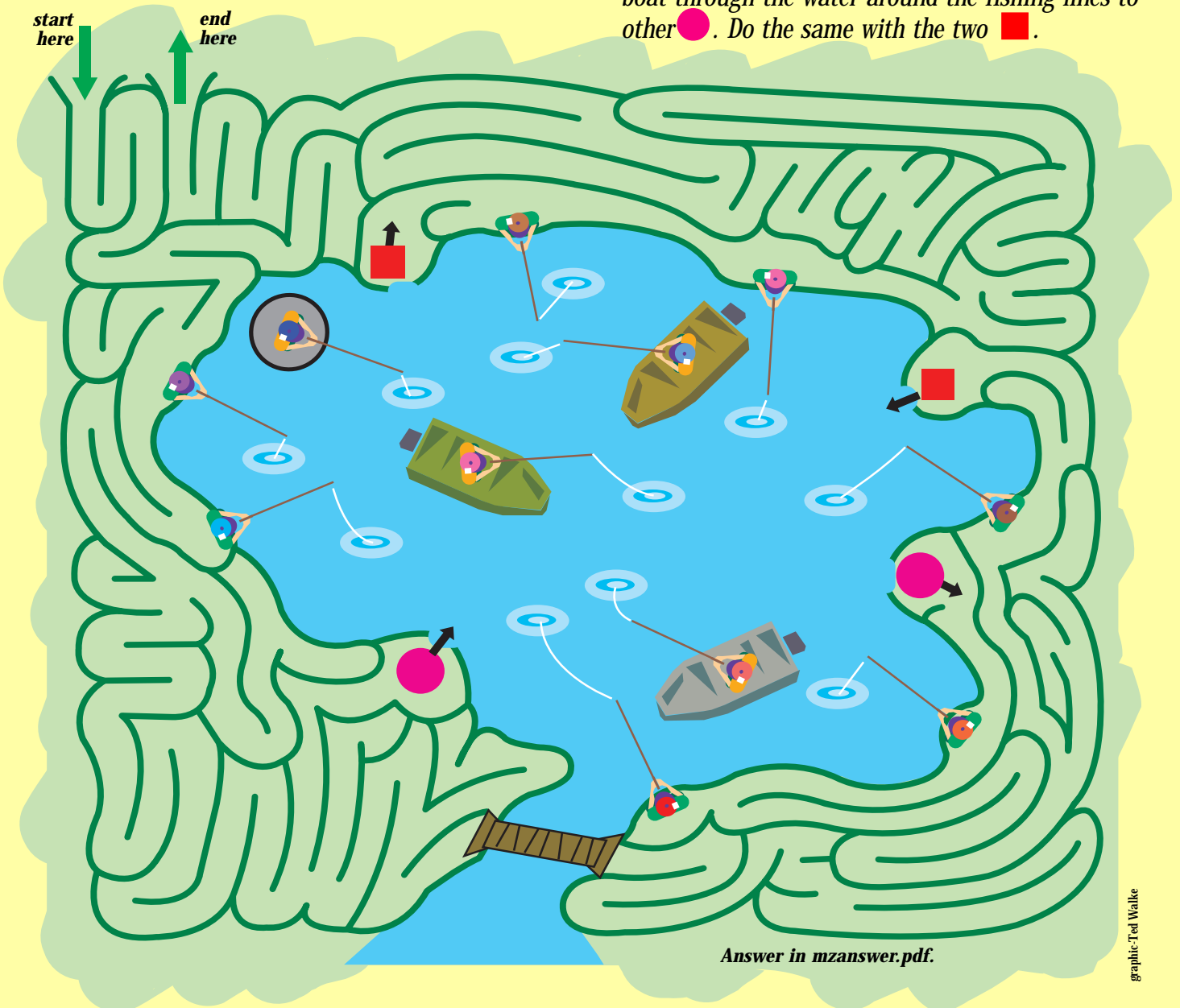
As a user of our many waterways, you will encounter other people. You are not the only one out there. We all must share our resources equally. And when you are on the water, courtesy and manners are the name of the game. By using the following tips, a day on your favorite river, stream, lake, or pond will make it a more enjoyable day.

- Always walk or move behind fishermen, or away from where they are casting. This way, you will not run into their lines.
- You don't need to hold a long conversation. Just say "Hi!" and continue on.
- Avoid boating during peak fishing times, like opening day of the trout season.
- Fishermen, please do not cast toward boaters.
- Avoid making unnecessary noise. Quiet is contagious.
